



Illinois State Library Map Collection

The Illinois State Library has two primary responsibilities: to serve as a research library for state government and to coordinate the statewide network (ILLINET) of more than 4,000 academic, public, school and special libraries. To fulfill its research role, the State Library has acquired a significant map collection with an emphasis on Illinois maps.

Most of the 185,000 maps in the collection are received through the Illinois and federal documents depository programs.

Illinois Maps

The State Library has a large collection of 19th- and 20th-century plat books and maps showing land ownership in rural area. The Sanborn fire insurance atlases on microfilm show urban areas of Illinois from the 1880s to the 1980s. The other Illinois maps include:

- County highway maps from 1937 to the present
- Official state highway maps from 1917 to the present
- General land office plats of Illinois on microfilm and CD-ROM (original and georectified)

- Illinois digital raster graphics and digital orthophoto quads on CD-ROM
- Historic aerial photos on CD-ROM for counties at www.isgs.uiuc.edu/nsdihome/webdoes/ilhap/
- Decennial census maps dating back to 1950
- Illinois topographic quadrangles dating back to the early 1900s

Statewide historical maps include Tanner's 1833 Illinois map and David Burr's 1834 Illinois map of postroads.

More recent maps include coal mine subsidence maps, taxing district maps, flood maps, census geography maps, wetlands maps, and election district maps.

The State Library also makes available outline maps for patrons who want to draw their own.

U.S. Maps

The U.S. map collection includes:

- State highway maps
- National forest maps
- Nautical charts
- County soil surveys

- City street maps
- Topographic maps for all states

Historical collections include the U.S. Geological Survey folios; maps of 19th century expeditions to the west; select county plat maps and atlases in microform; and decennial census maps for metropolitan areas back to 1960.

Foreign Maps

A select collection of foreign maps includes nautical charts of foreign waters, general maps of countries, and detailed late 19th- and early 20th-century maps on microfiche of Germany, Poland and Austria.
